Dear Mums, Dads, Carers and Friends

I am afraid that I need to start this week's newsletter with news about a serious incident which took place outside of school earlier this week.

On Monday afternoon, one of our Year 6 pupil's was hit by a car whilst crossing Chester Road. She was using the pedestrian crossing on the southbound carriageway when a car ran a red light and hit her.

The girl has now been released from hospital and returned to school. As luck would have it, it was her school lunch bag that took the main brunt of the impact. This probably saved her from further serious physical injury or worse. She was so, so lucky.

Having spoken with Trafford Council, I have been told that there should have been a crossing patrol officer there that day but due to staff absences it was decided that other crossings were more of a priority. No replacement was provided. No contact was made with school to alert us to the absence.

For many of us who were worried by the funding cuts for crossing patrol officers, this is exactly the situation we feared. Chester Road is an extremely dangerous road. Earlier this year a local resident was killed crossing at exactly the same place.

I have been in touch with Kate Green who immediately wrote to the chief executive of Trafford Council. I have also written to the council on behalf of the school.

Can I ask that any parent or member of our school family who is concerned by this incident to also contact Trafford council. Our Friends and Family (FAF) group are working on a response and I am sure they would welcome any support from you.

Please remind your children to stay safe.
