Sports Premium Report 2017 - 2018



Introduction

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2016/17 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. On 17th July 2017 the Department for Education confirmed that the Primary PE & Sport Premium will double from September 2017. Each school will now receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil - here at St. Matthew's CE Primary School that means around £16,510 a year. The money can **only** be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

St Matthew's CE Primary School appreciates the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

St Matthew's is committed to meeting the four key aims of the Sport Premium funding:

1. To improve the quality of PE teaching through continuing professional learning in PE.
2. To increase participation in sports and PE.
3. To increase quality of school sports and PE.
4. Understand and value the benefits of high quality PE and sport



As we are a **Rights Respecting School**, we also believe that children to give their opinion, and for adults to listen and take it seriously (Article 12). After consulting with the children in the school, they would like us to focus on:

Offering the opportunity to take part in a wider variety of sports through improved provision (more courts/pitches/tracks and equipment.
