They emphasised a need for dialogue with children about how they use the Internet (including mobile apps) in order to better understand the risks they might encounter. The session covered a number of useful websites and services to help inform parents about the potential risks and how to minimise them.

Find out more about the most popular social networks, sites and apps children are using. It gives a recommended minimum age and gives information on how to remove content, block people and report abuse.

Internet Matters – www.internetmatters.org

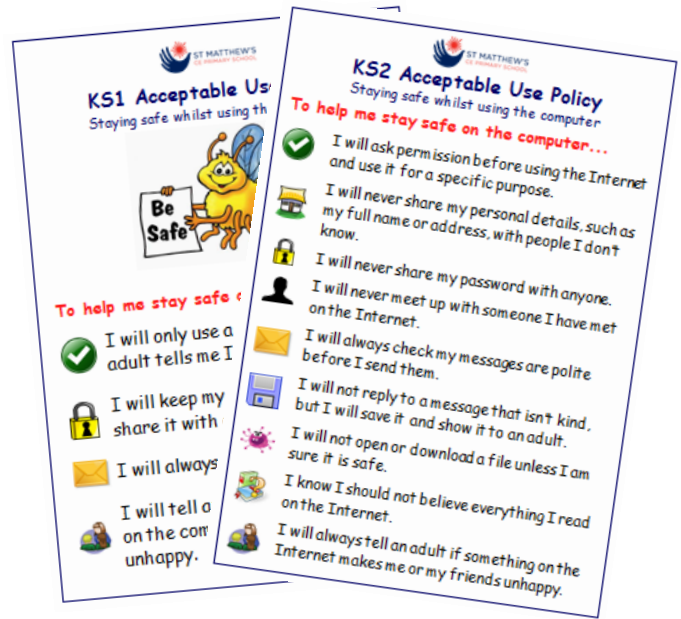
This site provides help setting up parental controls, which can help you filter or restrict content on your home Wi-Fi, as well as phones, tablets and games consoles.
